Uncommon Good is a nonprofit community development organization devoted to creating communities in which the basic needs of all can be met within a healthy environment. Its \$5 million budget funds the following programs:

Connect to College/CAUSA is a mentoring, tutoring, educational enrichment, urban farming and social service program that helps underprivileged students succeed in school and attend college. It includes Teen Green, a youth environmental and community service program, as well as comprehensive family social services. Currently Uncommon Good is bringing an innovative global mental health pilot program to the U.S. and will be the program's first site in this country.

Medicine for the Economically Disadvantaged is an educational loan repayment assistance program that helps physicians, dentists, pharmacists and optometrists repay their school loans so that they can afford to work in community clinics serving the poor. The program includes a medical career pipeline program for Connect to College/CAUSA students.

The *Whole Earth Building* is a first of its kind in the world green building, hand built using on-site earth for 85% of the construction material. The building serves as Uncommon Good's office and has had visitors from every continent with the exception of Antarctica.

Inner City Law Center is a nonprofit charitable organization that provides social services and legal aid to the homeless and poor of Los Angeles. Over 4,000 clients a year are served. It pioneered the development of slum housing litigation, winning multi-million dollar lawsuits on behalf of tenants living in uninhabitable conditions. It also participated as co-counsel in ground breaking litigation on behalf of the homeless.
